Budapest Declaration on World Heritage - 2002

“To ensure the active involvement of our local communities at all levels in the identification, protection and management of our World Heritage properties”.

Tokyo Experts Meeting - 2006

Communities and groups must be involved in the management of sites, not “just as mere informants” but included in the decision making process “also for key decisions”.

World Heritage Committee - 31st Session - 2007

“Heritage protection without community involvement and commitment is an invitation to failure”.

UNESCO Recommendation on Historic Urban Landscape - 2011

Historic urban landscapes are urban areas “understood as the result of a historic layering of cultural and natural values and attributes, extending beyond the notion of ‘historic centre’ or ‘ensemble’ to include the broader urban context and its geographical setting”.

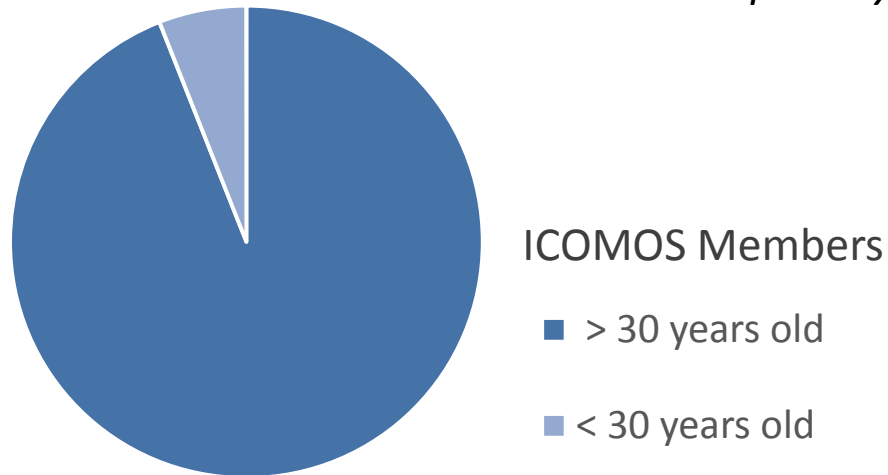

Adopted by the 18th General Assembly (November 2014)

The Programme sets a number of goals

- Expand the membership to include a greater number of young professionals;
- Develop awareness-raising programmes for heritage conservation among universities;
- Develop and promote ICOMOS' advisory role in government programmes at all levels (national, state, provincial, local) and NGOs;
- Actively recruit a broader membership, both geographically and in subject specialization;
- Explore possibilities to enlarge institutional membership to governments;
- Develop mentoring programmes to share and build on expertise

Adopted by the 18th General Assembly (November 2014)



“The reasons for this are multiple”, states the Programme:

- To maintain ICOMOS’ scientific relevance in a changing environment;
- To ensure generational renewal within the organisation, so as to safeguard its future continuity and sustainability;
- To ensure capacity building and that ICOMOS doctrinal and ethical approach reaches the professionals in our field at an early stage.

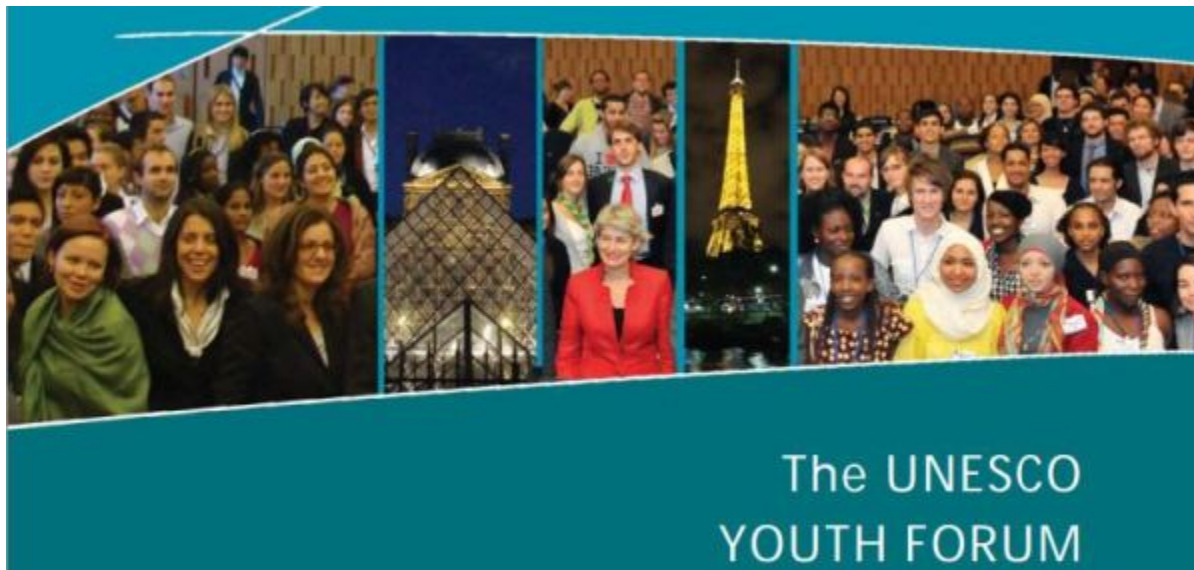
