

The Sky Train is a two-line urban mass transit system in Burnaby, British Columbia, Canada. It uses Bombardier's Advanced Rapid Transit technology, with fully automated trains running primarily on elevated guideways. The system consists of two lines, the Blue Line and the Green Line. The Blue Line's eastern section runs down Main Street in Burnaby, the western section runs along Kingsway in Coquitlam, the Purple Line in Delta, and the APM line in New Westminster. The system is owned by TransLink, a regional transportation agency. It operates on a proof-of-payment fare system and is funded by the South Coast British Columbia Transportation Authority (TransLink). The system is considered a rapid transit service. Early TransLink advertisements claimed the system to be the "world's first driverless train".

For all riders, directions, fares, and other information, visit the TransLink website. The system is also known as "SkyTrain" or "ST" (30 m (100 ft) of track make it the longest automated light rail transit system in the world). It also uses the term "train" to describe the vehicles, which are not trains in the traditional sense. There are 33 stations in the system, which serve more than 80,000 people every day in the two lines...
