





These mechanisms highlight and utilize intangible heritage elements, such as historic know-how, and they create new possibilities, where sustainability benefits from creativity and innovation


SENSING CITIES AND URBAN LANDSCAPES






The new conditions are transforming cities and the world urban landscapes


- Mass population movements between different areas and mostly directed towards larger cities.

- delinquency and violence




Historic cities and urban areas can contribute to the progress of mankind
