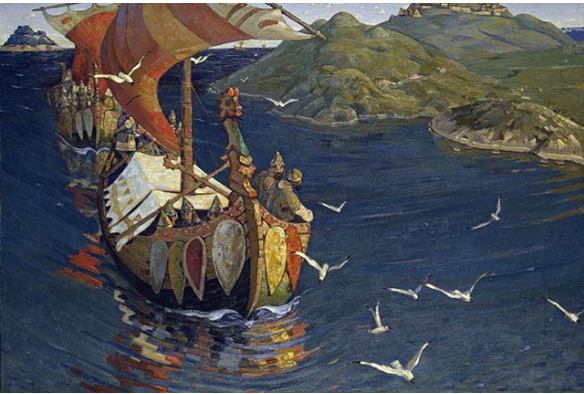


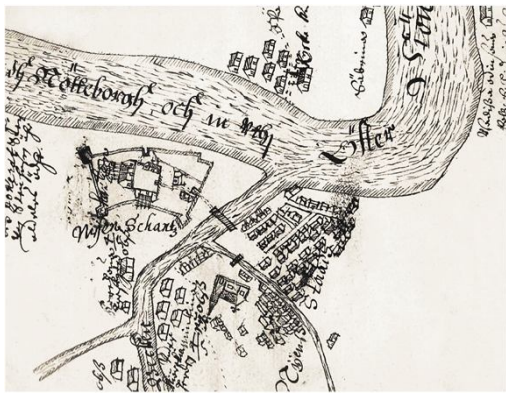
Trade route from the Varangians to the Greeks

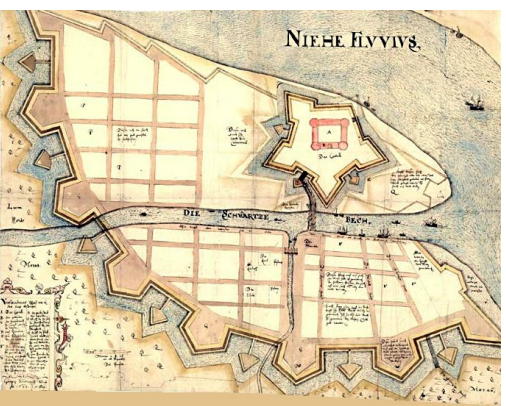

Nyenskans of 17 c. on Swedish maps and master plans

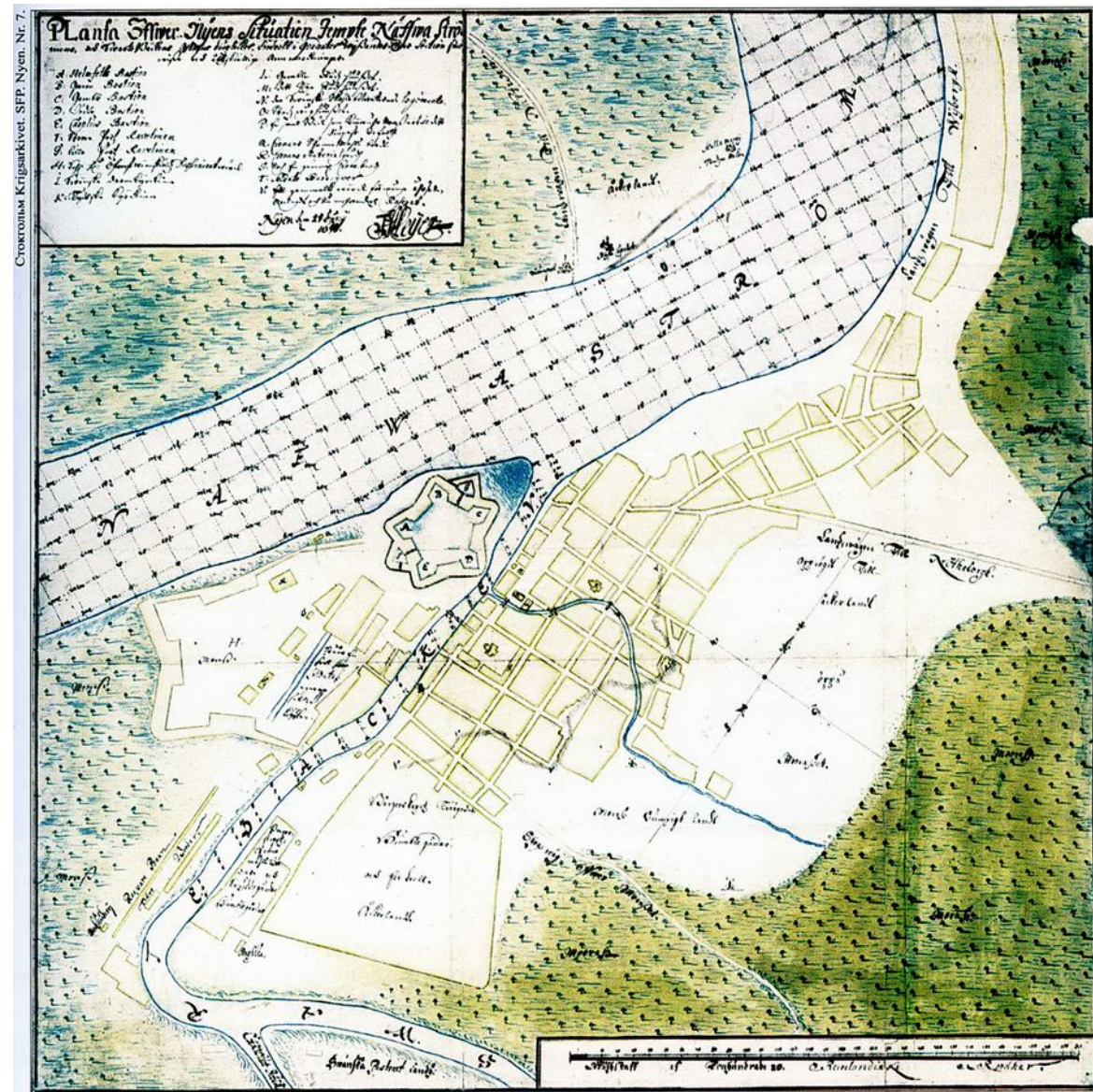

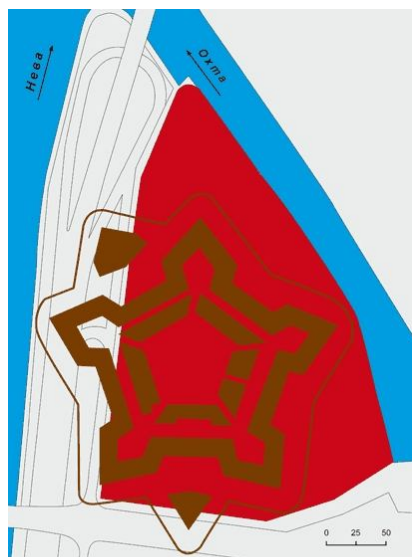

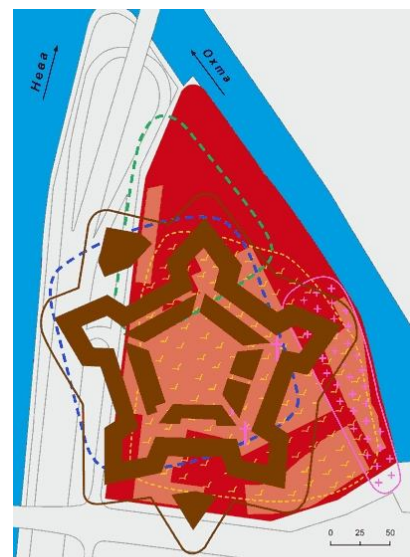

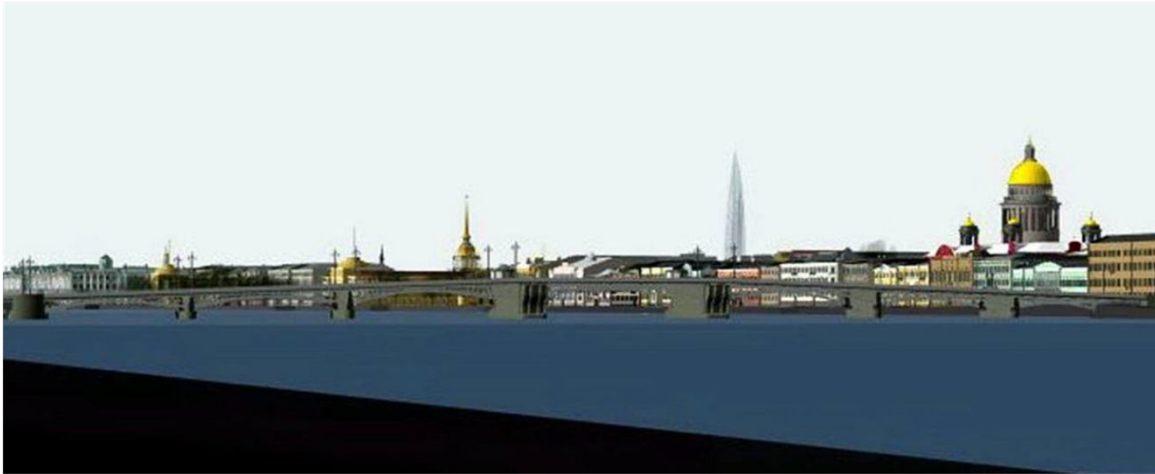

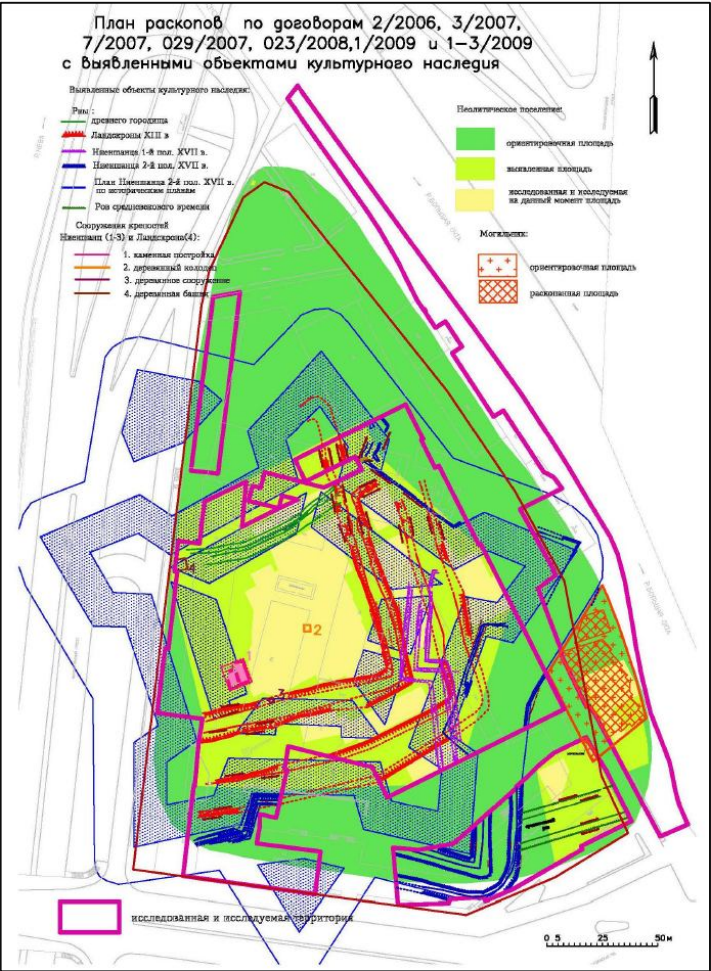
