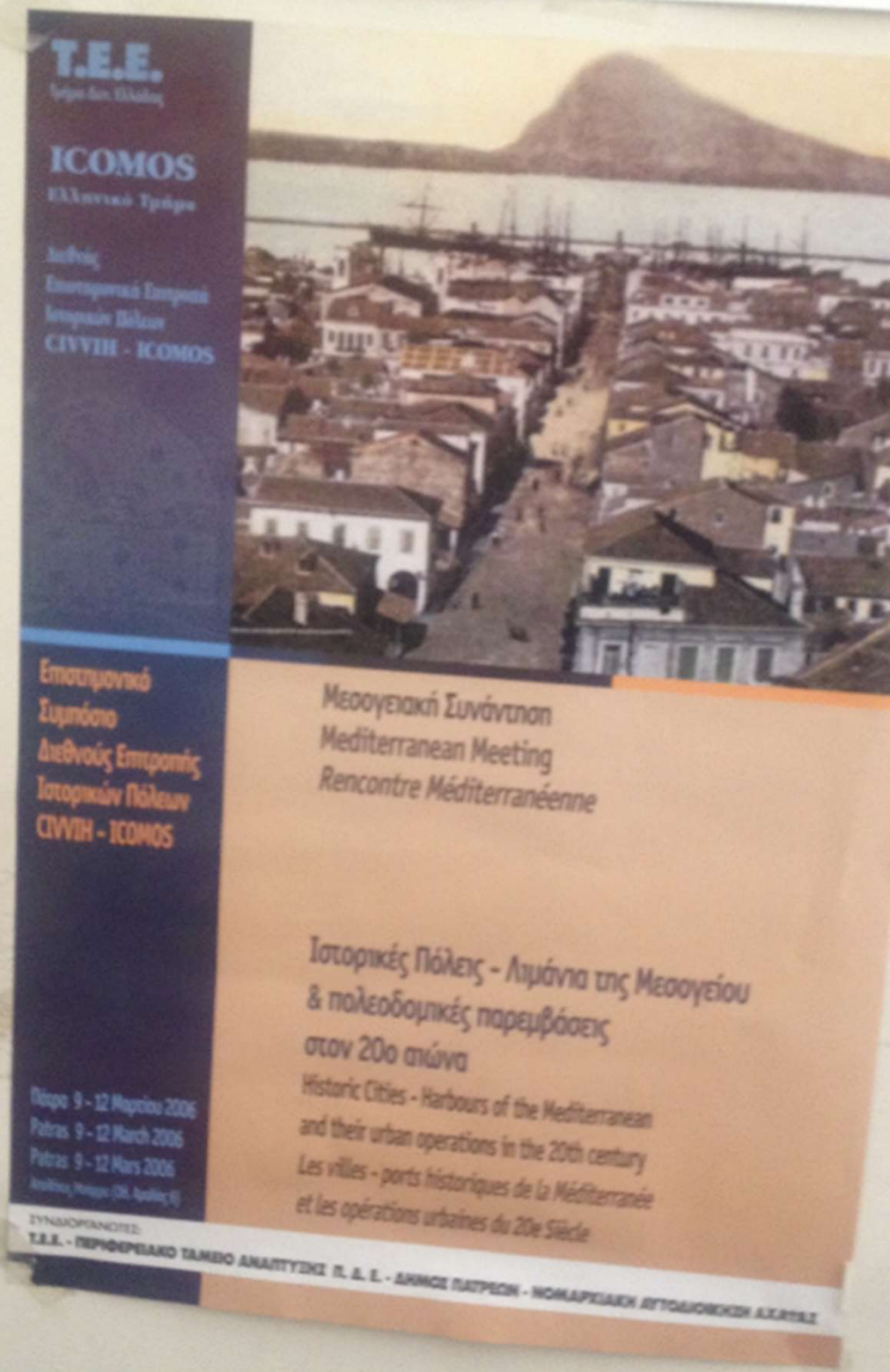




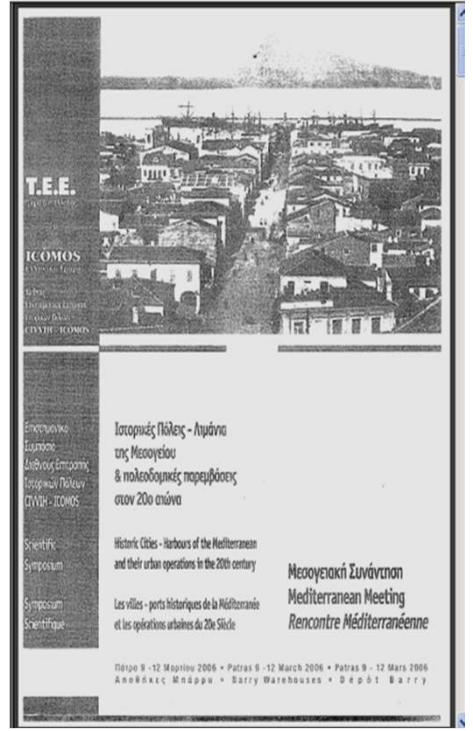

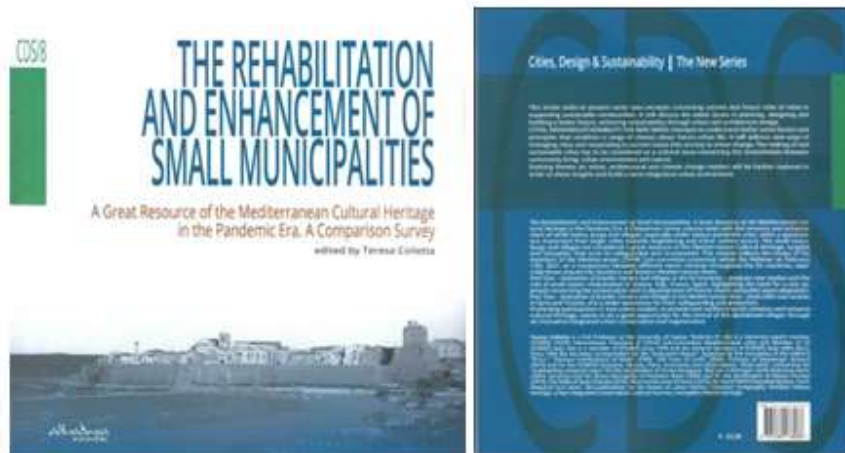

# Syntesis

*The Rehabilitation and Enhancement of Small Municipalities. A Great Resource of the Mediterranean Cultural Heritage in the Pandemic Era. A Comparison Survey* volume deals with the recovery and enhancement of small towns, burgs and villages, especially under today's pandemic crisis, when a spontaneous movement from larger cities towards neighboring and minor centers occurs. The small towns, burgs and villages are considered a great resource of the Mediterranean Cultural Heritage, tangible and intangible, that must be safeguarded and re-evaluated. This volume collects the essays of the members of the Mediterranean CIVVIH Sub-committee presented within the Webinar on February 12th, 2021, as a comparison between different minor contexts throughout the EU countries, especially those around the Southern and Eastern Mediterranean Basin.

*Part One – Evaluation of Smaller Centers and Villages in the EU Countries* – analyzes case studies and the role of small towns' revitalization in Greece, Italy, France, Spain, highlighting the need for a new approach concerning the conservation and re-development of historic towns and public space adaptation.

*Part Two – Evaluation of Smaller Centers and Villages in the Mediterranean Area* – deals with case studies in Syria and Tunisia, and a wider awareness for their safeguarding and protection.

Promoting participation in new urban models, to provide and reinforce social cohesion and enhance cultural heritage, seems to be a good opportunity for the revival of the abandoned villages through an innovative integrated urban conservation and regeneration.

## CLIMATE CHANGE IN HISTORIC TOWNS AND VILLAGES OF THE MEDITERRANEAN AREA

- Climate change is currently a reality and it is becoming a major concern in the world. It affects strongly historic towns, villages, and especially surrounding the Mediterranean Sea.
- UN-Habitat announced on “World Habitat Day” that cities are important actors to fight climate change.
- This meeting aims to feed thinking on new urban practices, regarding the capacity adaptation of the old centres the facing the consequences of climate change. The ambition of the meeting is also to propose an exchange platform allowing a list of the resilient ecological solutions carried out in the towns, villages and historic urban settlements in the Mediterranean.
- Climate change is currently a reality and it is becoming a major concern in the world. It affects strongly historic towns, villages, and especially surrounding the Mediterranean Sea.
- UN-Habitat announced on “World Habitat Day” that cities are important actors to fight climate change.
- This meeting aims to feed thinking on new urban practices, regarding the adaptation capacity of the old centres facing the consequences of climate change. The ambition of the meeting is also to propose an exchange platform allowing a list of the resilient ecological solutions carried out in the towns, villages and historic urban settlements in the Mediterranean.

- The goal is to analyse this problem by focusing on the Mediterranean basin. In order to measure its effects by integrating the question of risks in this maritime context of closed sea combined with wide variety of climatic and geomorphological situations as well as socio-economic and political ones.
- This symposium will focus on the relationship nature / culture in historic centres. Moreover, on the adaptability of urban heritage to the ecological transition and climate change that affects the old towns and villages of the Mediterranean. It will be an opportunity to deepen reflection on how communities and civil society will be involved in the adaptation of historic urban settings to climate change.
- Based on the cultural and heritage value, it will develop around two topics, which are the culture/nature relationship and the threats/risks with, in common Inventory Analysis and a diagnostic of current situation as well as the capacity for intervention, evolution and adaptation of the built heritage.
- It will be a time to bring up the issue of traditional know-how and practices related to the principles of the circular economy and the integrated development of local sectors.
- How to adapt the methodology and what tools to set up to in order to have depending on the economic and social contexts a strategy to the different scales of urban fabric (districts, cities ...)



# The two sections of the meeting:

- **1. Nature/culture and city /countryside**

- Cities are warming up faster than the rest of the territory. This fight requires a re - assessment of urban planning policies and strategies in the short, medium and long term. The question is How to integrate this issue in the high light projects for Mediterranean towns as well as ports and port cities.
- The role of vegetation in the city and the de-artificialization of soils. How to strengthen the presence of nature elements and integrate water management.
- Land use planning and urban planning tools to set up, heritage management and urban planning plan, recommendations and urban rules.
- Fighting against heat islets by creating summer comfort and winter comfort
- Create wooded and friendly spaces; public spaces, urban vegetables gardens
- Traditional Knox how and local practices to be developed for the adaptation to climate change in old centres.
- The relationship between the city and villages / countryside, artificialization of the soil, agricultural land and local resources
- What is the role of civil society in this project and what governance

- **2. Threats and risks**

- In this topic, bring up all the risks that affect our historic centres are important, whether natural or industrial, or contextual such as the risk of fire or economic and touristic. By the analyse of the issue of prevention by technical and human resources as action to fix
- What is their impact on the urban cultural landscape? What is the limit of tolerance and how to measure the adaptability of our urban heritage? What sacrifice is possible?
- Natural phenomena telluric movements, landslides and submersion
- Risks induced by climate change, drought, flooding
- The evolution and protection of the coast and the heritage bordering the sea as main problem.
- Tourism, consumerist or sustainable, brake or lever of adaptation to climate change in historic cities and villages especially port cities?
- The role of local communities in the development of urban cultural tourism
